Architecture Review Application Instructions FENCING

Documents and details Required for Architecture Team Review.

When all required documents are ready, Email them as attachments to: <u>HCPIIARC@Gmail.com</u>.

Required Documents

1. Completed Form for Fencing on website, then save to your computer.

You must include:

- a. Material and color for fence posts and rails (wood is recommended)
- b. Size, type, and color of wire mesh if to be installed
- c. Height of posts and height of top rail
- d. Purpose of fence

2. Diagram showing:

- a. Placement of the fence in relationship to house, property lines and roads.
- b. Approximate distance of fence from property lines, roads and utility easement.
- c. Orientation (which way is north).

Summary of the relevant rules in CC&Rs, Architecture Guidelines, and Rules and Regulations. You are expected to review these documents for additional details.

- Except for small ornamental fences, fences are not permitted in the front of the house.
- Maximum height for a fence is 5 feet.
- Fence materials should blend in with the land and vegetation
- Wooden posts and rails are preferred material
- Wire mesh may be added to fencing to keep pets in and critters out.
- Small ornamental fences should be under 30 inches tall and primarily a decorative feature.

Special consideration for dog runs/kennels under 144 sq ft

- May be up to 6' height
- See Architectural Guidelines for more details

Special exceptions for gardens under 144 sq ft

- Fine mesh screening may be used to keep birds and small animals out (See Architectural Guidelines, and Rules and Regulations for details)
- May be up to a height of 8 feet, however, for the area above 5 feet, light weight material should be used to minimize visual impact
